Kitchen use:

If your group is providing your own meals you have two options.

You will need to bring your own disposable plates, cups and silverware. Groups providing their own meals will also be responsible for cleaning up the kitchen and dining hall after each meal. No Cost.

2. With this option your group may use all of our kitchen facilities and equipment including ovens, walk-in cooler and freezer, cookware, tableware, and dish-room. All members of your party who wish to use the kitchen facilities must be trained in the use of all equipment, and the maintenance of health code regulations. Your group will be responsible to maintain all health code regulations. Usage of ovens and dishwasher/sanitizer will be limited to guests 16 years of age or older. Cost is \$50/meal.

At this time she will need to know: desired dates, approximate attendance expected, and if your speaker needs separate overnight accommodations. Once you have agreed upon dates, rates, and lodging, you will be penciled in our calendar and sent a contract. You have one month to return the signed contract and deposit (which will be deducted from the final bill). Once they have been received, your dates are guaranteed and Jason Folkmann, Associate Director, will become your contact for any questions or concerns you may have.

What to bring:

You will need to bring sheets, blankets or sleeping bag, pillow, bath towels, and laundry bag. Depending on your interests and the season you may want to bring a modest swim suit, outdoor and indoor shoes, and or boots.



Check-In & Check-Out:

Your lodging and meeting space will both be available by 4pm the day your contract begins. Your lodging rooms should be vacated by 1pm and meeting space by 3pm the day your contract ends. You are welcome to stay on the grounds until 4pm. If this creates a problem, please let us know in advance as we will always be flexible when possible.

Charges may apply if arriving early or staying late.

Upon departure, please make sure all trash is in trash cans and lights are turned off.

Billing:

You will receive a bill, with the deposit deducted, during your stay. No taxes will be added to the rates you have been given. The only fees added would be for damaged property. Payment is due within one week (if possible) but preferred upon departure. Groups receive one bill and should collect payment from all attendees and pay East Iowa Bible Camp one lump sum if possible.

Discounts:

Pastors pay half price for lodging and meals for their immediate family (spouse and dependent children).

A 10% discount on lodging is offered Monday Night -Thursday Night any time except Mid May-Mid August.

Barn:

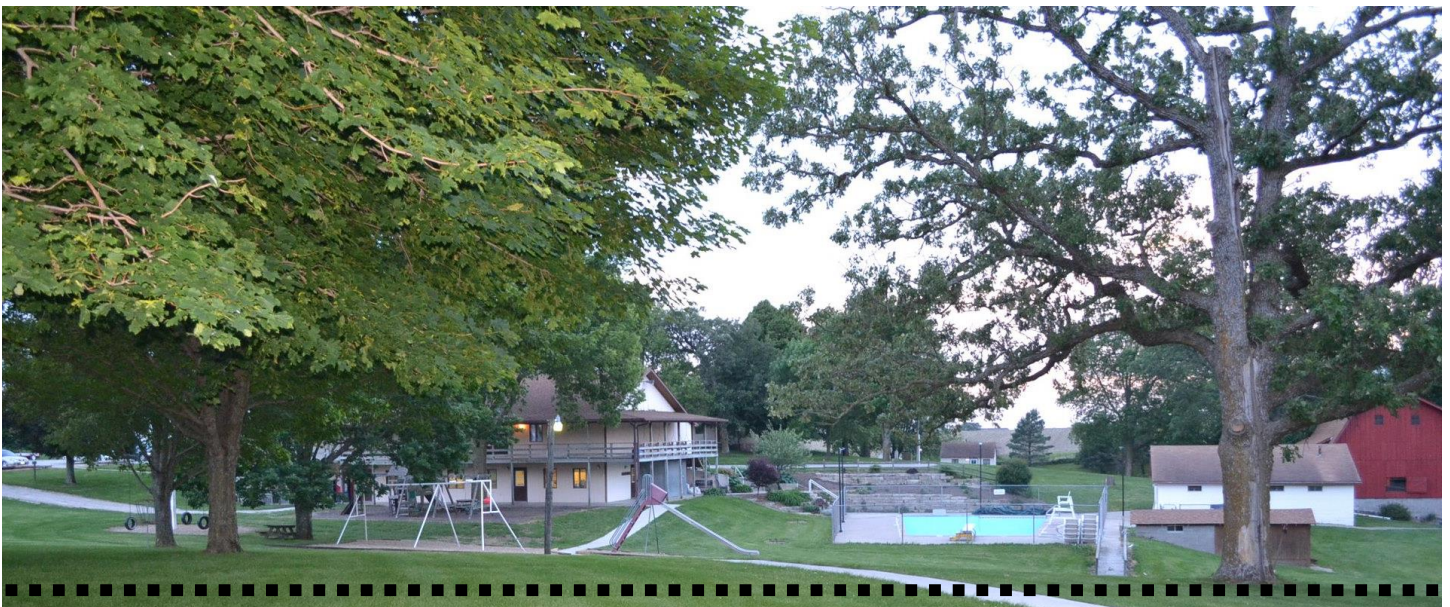

AGREES TO ABIDE BY THE FOLLOWING TERMS OF USE:

1. The group will furnish EIBC no later than 7 days prior to arrival date the following:

A. Conference schedule (including arrival, departure, and meal times)

B. Total number of guests attending including anticipated walk-ons.

The amount of food purchased, space reserved and minimum charge will be based on this number.

C. Cancellation of Event: 6+ months prior to start date: deposit will be refunded, 4-6 months: loss of deposit, 2-4 months 25% of total expected bill will be paid; 0-2 months, 50% of total expected bill will be paid.

D. In the event of last minute inclement weather, emergency or another circumstance that causes your group to cancel altogether or end your event earlier than the contracted reservation; EIBC will charge a 20% fee for scheduled lodging and meals. This includes the entire group leaving early or individual participants. Fee will be waived if retreat is rescheduled within 6 months.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

1. We have an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) on site it is located in the chapel office.
2. Safety guidelines are provided for your benefit. All emergency and safety procedures in regards to inclement weather, fire, injury, or illness are posted in each building. The Camp Director will assist in any of the above areas.
3. Lifejackets must be worn and fastened by anyone going onto the dock, or using a boat at the pond.
4. Fireworks, illegal drugs, power tools, firearms, ammunition, gasoline, flammable liquids, explosive or poisonous substances of any type must not be brought to the campground, unless with special permission from the Camp Director.
5. Vehicles are to be kept in the parking lot and around cabins, weather permitting, and may be driven on designated roads at the posted speed limit. Groups are forbidden to transport participants in vehicles not designed for passengers.
6. EIBC insurance covers all registered campers/groups. However, if the injured person carries primary insurance, EIBC insurance becomes secondary.
7. In case of an emergency, groups are responsible for providing their own transportation. The camp has 911 access.
8. All users are responsible for their own medical needs.
9. Pets are not allowed in any buildings (including cabins) and must be on a leash.
10. The Camp Director will designate certain buildings for your use, per your request. All other buildings are to remain unoccupied.
11. Smoking is prohibited inside all buildings.
12. If custodial attention is needed, contact the Camp Director or person in charge.
13. Camp Director will have final authority over any item not covered by this contract.

A ***nonrefundable*** deposit of \$100 and this signed contract must be received to hold a reservation. This deposit will be applied toward the event fee if the reservation is kept, and there are no damages to the campgrounds or facilities.

Final payment is due within one week (if possible) but preferred upon departure.

Note: Groups using the EIBC campgrounds must be in agreement with the EIBC doctrinal statement and exercise behavior in compliance with the use of facilities sheet and all stipulations of the above contract. Failure to comply with the above said information can result in your group being asked to leave the campground.

EAST IOWA BIBLE CAMP DOCTRINAL STATEMENT
